Aims for 2016-17

- 1. Disadvantage is identified early and needs addressed rapidly, so gaps in attainment and progress do not widen or emerge.
- 2. Pupils in receipt of the premium achieve as well as those not eligible (EYFS, Y1 phonics, KS1 and KS2 outcomes)
- 3. Pupils in receipt of the premium are able to access the full curriculum and wider opportunities
- 4. Pupils in receipt of the premium have their aspirations raised and self-esteem boosted

Main barriers to achievement faced by eligible pupils are; social learning and emotional resilience, health and wellbeing and attainment

% of Allocation	What difference will this make?
30%	Pupils at risk of underachieving are supported to catch-up or prevented from falling behind
