EYFS Understanding the world

Children will be encouraged to talk about what they have done with their families during Christmas' in the past. We will show photos of how Christmas used to be celebrated in the past and talk about the changes. We will be using world maps to show children where some of our stories are based. Use the Jolly Postman to draw information from a map and begin to understand why maps are so important to postmen. Share different culture's versions of famous fairy tales. To introduce children to a range of fictional characters and creatures from stories and to begin to differentiate these characters from real people in their lives. We will talk about stranger danger (based on Jack and the beanstalk). We will discuss occupations and how to identify strangers that can help us when we are in need.

Year 1 RE

The children will be learning to reflect on the Christmas story and decide what gifts would be meaningful for Jesus. Our enquiry question will be 'What gifts might Christians in my town have given Jesus if he had been born here instead of in Bethlehem?'

EYFS English

Phonics- Phase 2 and Phase 3, including sight words. Retell stories related to events through acting/role play. Christmas letters/lists. Retelling stories using images. Story Maps. Editing of story maps and orally retelling new stories. Sequence story – use vocabulary of beginning, middle and end. Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter– sound correspondences. Enjoys an increasing range of books.
Recognising and writing names.

EYFS Expressive Arts and Design

As part of our traditional tales the children will be making castle models. We will be making seasonal art, Firework pictures, Christmas decorations, Christmas cards, Divas, and Rangoli patterns. In the build up to Christmas we will be learning Christmas songs/poems. The children will be using story maps, props, puppets & story bags to support and encourage the children to retell, invent and adapt stories. We will be using different textures and materials to make houses for the Three Little Pigs and bridges for the Three Billy Goats.

Year 1 Music

The children will be learning about pulse, rhythm and pitch, rapping, dancing and singing through Reggae music. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with the Rhythm In The Way We Walk (Reggae style) and Banana Rap (Hip Hop style) songs, children will listen and appraise other Reggae music.

EYFS Music

The children will be listening to music and make their own dances in response.

PSHE

The children will be learning 'Celebrating Difference', all about accepting that everyone is different, including others when working and playing, knowing how to help if someone is being bullied, trying to solve problems, using kind words and learning how to give and receive compliments.

Physical Development

Fine Motor - threading, cutting, weaving, playdough, Fine Motor activities. Develop muscle tone to put pencil pressure on paper. Use tools to effect changes to materials. Show preference for dominant hand. Engage children in structured activities: guide them in what to draw, write or copy. Teach and model correct letter formation. Gross Motor - ball skills- throwing and catching. Crates play- climbing. Skipping ropes in outside area dance related activities Provide a range of wheeled resources for children to balance, sit or ride on, or pull and push. Two-wheeled balance bikes and pedal bikes without stabilisers, skateboards, wheelbarrows, prams and carts. The children will be following Real PE and learning basic skills such as running, balancing and ball skills. PE is on a Tuesday and Wednesday.
