

Maths

This half term the children will learn about Addition and Subtraction (within 100) and Multiplication and Division.

For Addition and Subtraction, the children will be looking at crossing tens as well as adding and subtracting tens.

For Multiplication and Division, the children will be focusing on the twos, five and ten times tables - with some starting to look at the threes in more depth.

Year 2 English

This half term the children will be looking at narratives and biographies. They will investigate the methods in which writers create these pieces of writing and use this knowledge to create their own versions starting off with the story 'Building Boy'.

Art

The children will learn about the visual elements of flowers, including shape, texture, colour, pattern and form. They will also explore various artistic methods, including drawing, printmaking and 3-D forms, using paper and clay.

PSHE

This half term the children will focus on 'Keeping Safe' where they will look at what they should or could do if they do not feel safe with others or when looking at they are poorly. Children will also look at how to tell someone if they do not like something.

RE

The children will learn about the Tibetan Buddhist New Year holiday, Losar, starts on the first day of the first month of the Tibetan calendar, which is usually in February. The children will also learn that Losar is also a family time when people clean their houses, wear new clothes, come together to eat, share in the traditions of the festival and spend time together.

D&T

The children will learn about making and strengthening structures, including different ways of joining materials through beach huts.

Computing

The children will learn about understanding of instructions in sequences and the use of logical reasoning to predict outcomes using programme such as Bee-Bot and Blue-Bot floor robots. They will also use given commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. They will

The children will learn about the physical and human features of coastal regions across the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby, in Yorkshire. The children will investigate tourism and jobs from the past and how this has changed now. The children will also enhance their understanding of using keys on maps and how to read them.

Science

The children will learn about the uses of everyday materials and how materials' properties make them suitable or unsuitable for specific purposes. They will also begin to explore how materials can
